The study illuminates the degree of employee satisfaction across various facets of the organization. Notably, it underscores that employees generally exhibit a degree of satisfaction with their roles. Recommendations derived from the study emphasize considerations such as salary, interpersonal relationships between employees and supervisors, effective grievance handling, and the provision of able opportunities for new hires by the organization.

Inference

According to the survey, 55 percent of the respondents indicate that their salary aligns with their performance, while 45 percent express dissatisfaction in this regard.

In terms of the relationship with their superiors, the majority of respondents (52.5%) report being highly satisfied. Additionally, 25 percent express satisfaction, 18.75 percent indicate dissatisfaction and only 3.75 percent are highly dissatisfied.

Regarding safety measures provided by the company, 45 percent of the respondents expressed satisfaction, with 20 percent being highly satisfied. On the other hand, 22.5 percent are dissatisfied and 12.5 percent are highly dissatisfied. The safety measures include provisions for fire safety and electrical safety.

6. FINDINGS

The survey results indicate a generally positive sentiment among respondents regarding various aspects of their work environment. A majority, comprising 57% of participants, expressed satisfaction with their work. Additionally, 45% of respondents expressed contentment with the company's efforts in ensuring safety measures for employees. When assessing the overall organizational environment, a substantial majority of 56% of respondents reported high satisfaction levels. Moreover, a notable 52.5% conveyed high satisfaction with their relationships with co-workers. These findings collectively suggest a positive perception of work-related factors among the surveyed individuals.



7. SUGGESTIONS

The organization stands out as a model employer, evidenced by the majority of respondents expressing satisfaction with working conditions, salary, bonuses, retirement benefits, and other aspects. The overwhelmingly positive feedback suggests that the current conditions should be maintained in the future. Despite the overall contentment among the entire stock of officers and officials, it is important to acknowledge a smaller group that has voiced dissatisfaction, a common occurrence in large organizations.

Effective recruitment, coupled with appropriate qualifications, holds the key to satisfying both customers and staff alike. Research consistently indicates that organizations boasting higher employee satisfaction levels tend to outperform those with a less contented workforce. To enhance employee satisfaction, managers should prioritize intrinsic aspects of the job; ensuring tasks are both challenging and engaging.
